In a small book, Dorothy keeps track of all 70 families. She sorts the clothing according to size and packs them based on each family's needs. Dorothy brings the package to the post office and off it goes
- One of the high points of her project was for her to send 76 boxes the year she turned she accomplished this task, and it shows just how much difference one person can make
- It is so gratifying to me when a neighbor comes by with an armful of clothes .I would rather have that than a thousand dollars. These are words of an 88-year-old woman; a heroine she is a woman who places importance on doing for others, even those she never met. The. people of Malawi were kind to her son when he was in the Peace Corps, and she has .returned the favor many times more
