Q_ and the root of many children's tales go back to ancient storytellers :

Q_ in the opening of Children's Literature: A Reader's History from Aesop to Harry Potter says,

A_ This book presents a history of what children have <u>heard and read</u>... The history I write of is a history of <u>reception."</u>

Q_ Children's literature can be divided into a number of categories, but it is most easily categorized according to:

A_ genre or the intended age of the reader.

Q_ A literary genre is:

A a category of literary compositions.

Q Genres may be determined by:

A_ technique, tone, content, or length

Q By age category Books for younger children tend to be written in:

A simple language, use large print, and have many illustrations.

Q By age category Books for older children use:

A_ increasingly complex language, normal print, and fewer (if any) illustrations.

- 1- Picture books, appropriate for pre-readers or children ages 0-5.

- 3- <u>Chapter book</u>, appropriate for children ages <u>7–12</u>.
 - o Short chapter books, appropriate for children ages 7–9.
 - o Longer chapter books, appropriate for children ages <u>9–12.</u>
- 4- Young-adult fiction, appropriate for children ages <u>12–18</u>.

Pictures have always accompanied children's stories

Modern children's books are:

illustrated in a way that is rarely seen in adult literature, except in graphic novels.

<u>Illustration</u> artwork <u>plays a greater role</u> in books intended for <u>younger readers</u> (especially pre-literate children).

 According to Aspects and Issues in the History of Children's Literature from the International Research Society for Children's Literature, the development of children's literature anywhere in the world follows the same basic path.

A_Its Possibility and Actuality

Q_ One claim that just because a <u>culture</u> does not view ch<u>ildhood</u> as <u>modern</u> Western societies do, <u>does not</u> mean;

A_ children's literature <u>cannot develop</u> there.

Q_modern Western scholars defined literature for children narrowly, and fail to A_ acknowledge what literature does exist

Q_Daniel Kline, in Medieval Literature for Children says modern and Medieval literature for children have common goals:

A_ "conveying the values, attitudes, and information necessary for children and youth to survive or even advance within their cultures.

A Hornbooks

Q An early example Russia's earliest children's books, primers;

A alphabet book published by Ivan Fyodorov

Q the first Swedish children's book

A Pretty and Splendid Maiden's Mirror, an adaptation of a German book for young women,

Q In Italy, Giovanni Francesco Straparola released;

A The Facetious Nights of Straparola

Q_ in the 1550s. <u>Called the first European</u> storybook to contain <u>fairy-tales</u>, it eventually had;

A_ 75 separate stories and written for an adult audience.

Q_Giulio Cesare Croce also borrowed from;

A stories children enjoyed for his books.

 Chapbooks, <u>pocket-sized</u> pamphlets that were often folded instead of being stitched, were published in <u>Britain</u>, eventually spreading to the United States. Illustrated by woodblock printing, these <u>inexpensive booklets</u> reprinted popular ballads, historical retelling, and folk tales.

A printed and distributed specifically for children.

Q became the first major published collection of European folk tales;

A Pentamerone.

Q_began recording fairy tales in France;

A_ Charles Perrault.

 They were not <u>well received</u> among the <u>French literary</u> society, who saw them as only <u>fit for old people and children</u>

 Jan Ámos Comenius in <u>Bohemia</u> published the <u>informative</u> illustrated <u>Orbis Pictus</u>, for children under <u>six</u> learning <u>to read</u>. It is considered as the <u>first picture book</u> produced specifically for children.

Q_ one book from this movement that is still widely read today is <u>The Pilgrim's Progress</u>;

A_ by John Bunyan.

Q_ There are sources that claim hornbooks was brought from England by the Puritans to;

A help educate their children.

Q The first children's book published, in what would become the United States, was a;

A catechism

Q_ As the <u>first contemporary</u> adventure <u>novel</u>, <u>Robinson Crusoe</u> quickly became;

A_ one of the most popular books in all English literature

Q Robinson Crusoe by

A_ Danial Defoe, an English Puritan.

Q Englishman John Newbery published;

A_ A Little Pretty Pocket-Book

- Q A Little Pretty Pocket-Book it reflected;
- A_ Jean-Jacques Rousseau's
- Q Rousseau's ideas also had great influence in;
- A_ Germany.
- Those ideas developed into <u>German Philanthropism</u>, a movement concerned with reforming both <u>education</u> and <u>literature for</u> children.

Q_ According to <u>Hans-Heino</u> Ewers in The <u>International Companion Encyclopedia</u> of Children's Literature,;

A_ "It can be argued that from this time, the history of European children's literature was largely written in Germany".

Q_ which was translated many times;

A_ The Adventures of Pinocchio,

Q_ story established the genre of realistic family books in the United States

A coming of age

Q many writers of stature in the Hindustani began writing books for children

A_ In India

- The first full-<u>length children's</u> book was <u>Khar Khar Mahadev</u> by <u>Narain Dixit</u>, which was <u>serialized</u> in one of the popular <u>children's magazines</u> in 1957.
 - Q_ <u>flourished in</u> the later part of the twentieth century.

A_Benagli children's literature.

• Educator <u>Gijubhai Badheka</u> published over <u>200 children's books</u> in the <u>Gujarati language</u>, and many of them are still popular.

- The first pieces of literature intended solely for <u>Chinese children</u> were <u>translations</u> of <u>Aesop's fables</u>, <u>Western fairy tales</u>, and The <u>Arabian Nights</u>.

- Chinese Revolution of 1949 changed children's literature again. Many children's writers were denounced, but Tianyi and Ye Shengtao continued to write for children and created works that aligned with Maoist ideology. Q_ In Langston Hughes' poem "Dreams," he uses similes, metaphors, and personifications to;

A_ create a <u>theme</u> that shows us that our <u>dreams</u> give <u>our lives meaning</u> and purpose, they allow us to be what we can all be and to a<u>ccomplish</u> all we can accomplish.

• Without our <u>dreams</u>, we can't <u>"fly</u>." Without them, our <u>lives are barren</u>; nothing can grow or <u>bloom</u> within us.

A_ that you should never give up on your hopes and dreams.

Q_ The message of this part of a poem is;

A that life can be hard and struggling as a broken-winged bird trying to fly but cannot.

Q_ Lastly, Langston Hughes uses similes to;

A create a very cold and sad mood in the poem.

Q_ In the <u>second stanza</u> of the poem, the speaker says "<u>Life is a barren field</u>/ <u>Frozen with snow</u>." What the speaker is trying to say is that life can and would be;

A cold, nothing would grow within us without our dreams.

Q Langston Hughes compares life to;
