1) Is the study of the talk produced in ordinary human interactions. At its core, conversation analysis is a set of methods for working with audio and video recording of talk and social interaction

2) Composed of two turns produced by different speakers which are placed adjacently and where the second utterance is identified as related to the first

- conversation analysis

3) (not allowing to continue) further discussion by repeating the same phrase or sentence over and over

- **the conversational strategy of forestalling**
- adjacency pair

4) is the spoken exchange of ideas, observations, opinions, or feeling. Adjective: conversational

5) is the assumption that participants in a conversation normally attempt to be informative, truthful, relevant, and clear.

6) make your conversational contribution such as is required, at the stage at which it occurs, by the accepted purpose or direction of the talk exchange in which you are engaged

7) (as, oh, like, and you know) that is used to direct or redirect the flow of conversation without adding any significant paraphrasable meaning to the discourse

- principles
- **a discourse marker**

8) is speech that repeats ,in whole or in part,what has just been said by another speaker sometimes called simply echo

- **An echo utterance**

9) a fragmented ,elliptical,or incomplete sentence or clause that still conveys meaning .also called sentence fragment

- **minor sentence**

10) is the process of sending and receiving messages without using words ,either spoken or written

- An echo utterance
- **nonverrrbal communication**

11) in phonetics , a break in speaking;a moment of silence. adjective :pausal

- **pause**

12) acts that express concern for others and minimize threats to self esteem in particular social contexts

- **politeness strategies**

13) intended to avoid giving offense by highlighting friendliness these strategies include juxtaposing criticism with compliments establishing common ground ,and using jokes,nicknames ,tag question, special discourse markers (please), and in group jargon and slang

14) are intended to avoid giving offense by showing deference .these strategies include questioning ,hedging.and presenting disagreements as opinions

- **negative politeness strategies**

15) the use of laughter as the oral equivalent of punctuation at the end of a spoken phrase or sentence

- **punctuation Effect**
